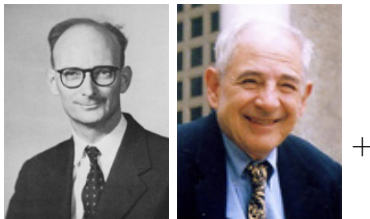
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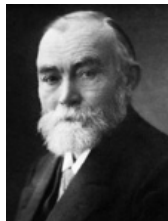
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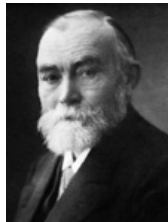

Aim: integrated speech act theory

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Integrated Speech Act Theory:

try to explain speech acts in terms of

- how particular facts (**social facts**) depend on agreement, and
- how truth-functional meaning affects mutual joint belief.
